



1.) In the following exercise you need your knowledge from last week. I'd like you to form the comparative degree **AND** add the correct ending to the adjective.

hint: you know that you form the comparative by adding "er" to the adjective. Now just add the required adjective ending to the "er".

sentence	translation
1.) Meine jüngere (jung) Schwester heißt Melodina.	My younger sister is called Melodina.
2.) Meine ältere (alt) Schwester heißt Maryjane.	My older sister is called Maryjane.
3.) Sie hat größere (groß) Augen (pl) als du.	She has bigger eyes than you.
4.) Ich habe einen besseren (gut) Lehrer (m) als du.	I have a better teacher than you.
5.) Ich möchte ein schnelleres (schnell) Auto (n).	I'd like a faster car.
6.) Sie kennt interessantere (interessant) Leute (pl).	She knows more interesting people.
7.) Ich habe eine lustigere (lustig) Freundin als du.	I have a funnier girlfriend than you.
8.) Ich möchte einen modernerer (modern) PC (m).	I'd like to have a more modern pc.
9.) Er braucht ein besseres (gut) Auto (n).	He needs a better car.
10.) Sie hat die dümmeren Kumpels.	She has the more stupid buddies.

2.) Now do the same with the superlative degree.

sentence	translation
1.) Sie schläft in dem dunkelsten (dunkel) Raum (m).	She sleeps in the darkest room.
2.) Sie hat die beste (gut) Mutter der Welt.	She has the best mother of the world.
3.) Ich steige auf den höchsten (hoch) Berg (m).	I climb the highest mountain.
4.) Das ist meine bunteste (bunt) Hose (f).	That are my most colourful pants.
5.) Sein Auto ist das schnellste (schnell) Auto (n).	His car is the fastest car.
6.) Der Juni ist der wärmste (warm) Monat (m).	June is the warmest month.
7.) Sie geht nur in die teuersten (teuer) Geschäfte (pl.).	She only goes into the most expensive shops.
8.) Das ist meine bequemste (bequem) Jeans (f).	That are my most comfortable jeans.
9.) Heute war der schlechteste (schlecht) Tag (m).	Today was the worst day.
10.) Er hat das meiste (viel) Geld (n).	He has most of the money.



3.) Finally, use the expression "... so ... wie" and translate the sentences into German

remember The expression is always the same: "so + adjective + wie"

German	English
1.) <u>Cathy ist so groß wie Kristine.</u>	Cathy is as tall as Kristine.
2.) <u>Tom ist so dick wie Neslon.</u>	Tom is as thick (=dick) as Nelson.
3.) <u>Ich bin so lustig wie Joy.</u>	I'm as funny as Joy.
4.) <u>Sie ist so klug wie er.</u>	She is as clever as him.
5.) <u>Der Toyota ist so schnell wie der Mercedes.</u>	The Toyota is as fast as the Mercedes.
6.) <u>Sie sind so alt wie ich.</u>	They are as old as me.
7.) <u>Der neue Lehrer ist so klug wie der alte.</u>	The new teacher is as clever as the old one.
8.) <u>Deine Haare sind so lang wie meine Haare.</u>	Your hair is as long as my hair.
9.) <u>Cathys Nase ist so klein wie Janes Nase.</u>	Cathy's nose is as small as Jane's nose.
10.) <u>Eine Pizza kostet so viel wie ein Hamburger.</u>	A Pizza costs as much as a hamburger.
